How we have used funds raised so far

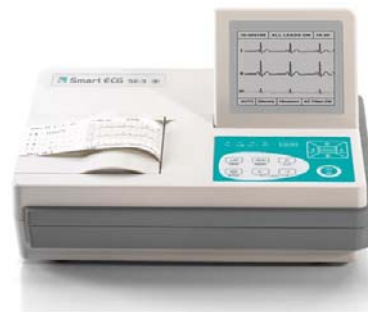
Georgie's Funds main aim is to raise money to fund research into new treatments and a cure for Neuroblastoma. We do this by giving a lot of the money we raise to the Neuroblastoma Society. The reason we do this is that all potential research projects need to be scrutinized by a scientific advisory board to ensure they are genuine and related to Neuroblastoma. The NSOC already has such a board who are experienced in vetting such applications.

Georgie's Fund has also donated funds to Chase Children's Hospice and play equipment to the MIBG suite at The Marsden. We have also replanted a garden at the children's cancer ward at St. Peters Hospital in Surrey. We are also hoping to send a little 5 year old boy who has incurable Neuroblastoma to swim with the dolphins in Elat.

They replied without hesitation that they would like an Electrocardiograph Monitor which would be kept on the children's ward!

Currently, when children need an ECG they have to be ferried over to St. George's Hospital in Tooting! Our George in fact experienced this and had to go to St George's for an ECG, when he was a patient at the Marsden.

The cost of an ECG Monitor is £21,000. The money you have raised will go a long way towards the purchase of this vital piece of equipment. We hope that with the help of some other organizations we will be able to purchase this equipment for them really soon!

We really would like to say a huge thank-you to all of you for your amazing fundraising efforts over the past year and it was lovely to meet you.
